



## Meeting Summary for December 3, 2006

Approved January 28, 2007

### Meeting Summary:

The Churchville-Chili Lacrosse Club meeting was called to order by Steve Grogan, President, at 7:05 PM.

The minutes for the September 23, 2006 meeting were voted on and unanimously approved.

Jean Mee, Club Treasurer, reported that the Lacrosse Club account has a current balance of \$5,485.59.

- We currently owe \$3,350.00 to TSE for winter league fees.
- We expect to bring in approximately \$2,000 in league fees from players.
- The club will pay \$100 towards the Varsity, JV, Mod-Thursday and Mod-Saturday leagues
- The 3/4 and 5/6 teams owe \$25 for their winter league fees and the Club will pay that.

Fundraiser Results: We made a profit of \$2,325.00. Nice Job everyone!

- Total ticket sales = \$3,715.00
- Paid out \$700 in prizes (we had a few days of no winners – ticket not sold)
- We gave 24 people a \$25 credit for selling all their tickets. Total = \$600
- Expenses: \$80.00 to have the tickets made and approx \$10 in postage to mail out checks.
- FYI: The 3/4 and 5/6 teams sold \$600 worth of tickets.

Todd Yunker, Coaches Coordinator, discussed the tournament and league results. All our teams are doing GREAT. Be sure to check the website [c-clacrosse.com](http://c-clacrosse.com) for all the details.

Coach Childs was on hand to talk about the school clinics. We have over 40 kids attending the clinics each week. He is very happy with the participation level and plans to continue the clinics after the holidays on Tuesday and Friday nights. Friday nights he's had to limit the attendance since the gym in the Intermediate School is very small. Coach Childs has checked into the availability of TSE's big field to hold some clinics. The price is \$195/hour. Steve Grogan will call to schedule a couple of times over the February break. The Club will ask kids to chip in to defray the costs. We can also look at Salmon Creek for practice fields.

We discussed if we should invite the RIT lacrosse team to come to one of our practices again. This would be for 7 – 12 graders. We will see if we could hold the practice at RIT so that the college players wouldn't have to travel. Val Hemink will contact the RIT Coach, Gene Peluso, and report back to the Club.

Coach Childs will contact Frank Lupiani to set up a time for him to work with the boys. Mr. Lupiani, parent, is an athletic trainer and has volunteered his services.

We have lots of tournaments coming up. Players will be invited by the coaches to participate.

By-Laws: We discussed the terms limits for the officers. We will put out a proposal for changing the terms “not to exceed two consecutive years” and “...three consecutive years” and vote at the January meeting.

Nominations for officers were taken. Providing the by-laws are changed, Val Hemink will run for secretary, Jean Mee for treasurer, Todd Yunker for Coaches Coordinator, and Gino Marcello for President. Mike Preston was nominated as President or Vice President, pending the outcome of the change in by-laws.

New Business:

Club members in attendance approved the purchase of 75 jerseys not to exceed \$20 each. The club will use the funds already collected to pay for the new jerseys. These jerseys will be the property of the Club. If the players do not return the jersey, there will be a \$20 replacement fee. The orange/white reversible pinnies will be used as practice jerseys and players may keep those. Todd Yunker and Val Hemink will work with Kevin Gray on the sizes needed. . The team parents will distribute the jerseys, collect them at the last game, and wash/store them for next season. If time permits, we *hope* to surprise the boys with the new jerseys in time for winter league.

Chili Recreation – Youth Lacrosse will be adding a K-2 team and will expand to two 5/6 teams. Lacrosse on the Westside is sure growing! They also want to offer a 4-6 grade girls team and are looking for a girls coach. If you know of someone, please let us know.

This brought up a question from a parent... can girls can play with the boys' teams at TSE? Todd Yunker will look into this and will also find out if the US Lacrosse membership will cover a girl playing on a boys' team.

Len Hemink asked if the Club would purchase extra goalie equipment. It was decided that we would wait until this summer and try to fund that with next year's fundraiser. In the meantime, Coach Childs has extra equipment that he can loan us. Len also asked about buying more lacrosse balls. Parents said they could bring some from home. If your child accumulates practice lacrosse balls – please ask them to return them. They cost over \$2 per ball and get rather expensive.
