DSL Field Monitors

It has been mandated by Dr. Ronald Bowes, that all soccer home games have a designated *Field Monitor*. The responsibilities of the *Field Monitor* are:

1. Be at all home soccer games
2. Identify him/herself to the referees before the start of the game
3. Address any fans, spectators, parents, players, etc who demonstrate inappropriate behavior, language and/or gestures
4. Give one verbal warning for inappropriate behavior, language and/or gestures. Warning will include that any further infractions will result in ejection from the field and 1-5 game suspension (at the discretion of the DSL and Dr. Ronald Bowes).
5. Inform the referees when a verbal warning has been issued and to whom
6. Inform the referee if there are further infractions by that same individual(s)

The referees will inform the appropriate coach(es) of the verbal warning and who the spectator(s) is.

The referee will eject the spectator(s) from the game. The referee has the authority to call the game if the spectator(s) are disrupting the game or overly disrespectful, rude and inappropriate.

The coach will notify, by phone, the DSL, their school principal, and their school athletic director of the ejection within 48 hours. The phone call is to be followed up by a written description, to the coordinator of the DSL, of what occurred during the game, who the spectator(s) was and their address and phone number, and who the referees were.
