

ELIGIBILITY INFORMATION

There are six (6) Divisions within Conference:

- Junior Gremlin Division (flag) ages 6 - 7 - 8
- Gremlin Division ages 8 - 9 - 10
- Junior Pee Wee Division ages 9-10-11
- Pee Wee Division ages 10-11-12
- Junior Midget Division ages 11-12-13
- Midget Division ages 12-13-14

For purposes of determining division, age is calculated by the participant's age as of December 31st of the present calendar year. For example, if your child's is currently 11 years old, but will turn 12 years old on November 10, 2006 he or she is considered *12 years old* for purposes of selecting the appropriate division.

WEIGHT CHART

Certification Weight must be met on September 1st.

At Certification, each participant will be weighed wearing only gym shorts. Although as the season progresses, a slight weight increase (about 2 pounds per month) is permitted, all players *must* be at or under the allotted weight. Before each game, each player will be weighed wearing shoes, socks football pants (with pads), and a tee shirt (no helmet or shoulder pads). At all times, every participant must be at or below the maximum weight. If, on game day, a player fails to make weight, that player will not be allowed to participate in that game.

How to use this chart: Johnny is currently 9 years old. His birthday is September 13, 2006. For purposes of registration, Johnny *is 10*, not 9. Looking down the left hand column of the weight chart look for "Age 10". Next, moving from left to right, we see that if Johnny is between 55 and 85 pounds, he could enroll as a Gremlin; if he is between 85 and 105 pounds, he could enroll as a Jr. Pee Wee; if he is between 105 and 125 pounds, he could enroll as a Pee Wee. Lets also assume that Johnny is registering in April and currently weighs 83 pounds. Johnny is a healthy, growing boy. Under these circumstances, if Johnny's parents think he will put on between 3-5 pounds over the next few months they should enroll Johnny as a Jr. Pee Wee – that way, he will have no difficulty making weight at the August Certification.
